Principal's Message

Dear Eagle families and friends,

Yellow Springs is growing! Our enrollment currently stands at 464 with additional enrollments expected in the coming months. This is certainly above the projection of 438 for our school this year! Class sizes are the largest in our primary grades, which could speak to future trends for YSES. Many new families are coming to our area for the quality of life that Frederick offers *and* the exemplary education provided through Frederick County Public Schools. The Yellow Springs community should stand proud that many of these newcomers are selecting Yellow Springs as their school of choice! It certainly "takes a village" to create an exemplary school, so on behalf of the entire Yellow Springs staff, I express our sincere gratitude for all that our community and families do for us! We are so very grateful for the compassionate service that you give so willingly. *Our volunteers ROCK*! Listing all the things that volunteers have accomplished since the beginning of school would surely prove to fill far more space than we have, so please accept this gesture as a "grand thank you" to all! Our students are thriving, our grounds are beautiful, our spirit is growing, and our school community is united. Thank you for your continued dedication to our students, staff and school!

We hope that you have had the opportunity to check out all the remodeling that was done during the summer months. Kindergarten, first grade and two of the second grade classrooms have new walls, doors and floors. Two fifth grade classrooms and one fourth grade classroom, along with an intervention room, also received new walls, doors, and flooring. The heating, cooling and alarm systems have been updated, and fresh paint was applied. New work areas for volunteers were built in the kindergarten and first grade areas, along with new bulletin boards for classrooms and hallways. White wipe-off boards were also put in many classrooms, as well as area rugs for class meetings and whole group instruction. An additional bathroom for the kindergarten area has been framed and will be completed this fall. We feel like we are in a new building! We have the promise that our promethean boards and the ceiling-mounted projectors will be installed this month. Keep your fingers crossed! *And*, we have even more to look forward to! Completion of Phase II will take place during the summer of 2013, when the "middle" of our building will receive walls, doors and new flooring as well. The front entrance and office area will be redesigned adding additional security for the students and staff during the school day. We are also in the development stage for roadway and parking improvements that would also be completed during the coming summer months. This will definitely improve arrival and dismissal procedures, as well as parking for events! *Hooray*! We will keep you updated as additional details are finalized.

Two new county assessments, called Global Scholar, have been given to our second, third, fourth and fifth graders. These assessments will provide additional data related to individual math and language arts proficiencies. This information is aiding teachers in making informed instructional decisions. In addition, all grade level teams are working diligently on understanding and implementing new curriculum. Our weekly professional learning sessions for every grade level are imperative to this professional growth. I wish you could see the "brain power" that exists during our "PL" sessions! Please take note of the announcement included in this newsletter related to community meetings sponsored by our county where local, state-wide, and national changes in education will be discussed. Of course, specific questions can always be presented to our teachers or to me, as well.

Our hope is that you enjoy the excitement of this new school year! Plan to visit and continue to communicate with us so that together we will always live up to our motto. "We are....Yellow Springs! Expect excellence everywhere!"
