6<sup>th</sup> grade HAL science teacher Matt Isleib and 6<sup>th</sup> grade HAL language arts teachers' Emma Kaveney and Jenna Waybright have teamed up to support students with this year's science fair project. Students will work on the research component in LA classes during the two weeks before Thanksgiving break.

7<sup>th</sup> grade HAL social studies teacher Holly Jung is allowing students who score a 90% or better on a unit pre-assessment to work with Specialists on independent projects related to the topic.

Math- Ms.Boyle's and Mrs. Stultz's merit classes have begun working with decimal operations such as adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing decimal numbers. Honors classes will be modeling the division of fractions and applying the models to help them understand which process of mathematics occurs when students divide fractions.

Language Arts- Mrs. Kaveney's and Mrs. Waybright's classes have just finished the "Growing Up" unit. The next unit, "Our Traditions/Ourselves", will focus on traditions we carry on as well as learn about new traditions. This unit will carry them through the holiday break. There will be a rigorous analysis of "A Christmas Carol" by Charles Dickens where students will explore characterization, theme, point of view and episodic structure.

Science- Mr. Isleib's students are working on the control systems (nervous and endocrine) in our human body unit. Students are gearing up for the CRES test which includes material from both the structural and control systems. Social Studies- Mrs. Georgi's and Mrs. Troy's classes are moving into their second unit on Egypt, Israel and the Phonecians.

**Visual Arts-** Mr. Snyders' classes are finishing an optical art unit. Currently, the students are creating a mask design. The students are using elements of art and principles of design in their work. Recently, the focus has been on color, contrast, and emphasis.

World Language Exploratory- Mrs. Gadra's classes will continue to focus on the French language. Students will learn the following: how to ask and respond to "How are you doing", how to describe the student's nationality, to tell where the student is originally from, and family vocabulary. Latin may also be introduced this month.



**Math-** Mr. Erb's and Mr. Pereira's classes are in the middle of Unit 3, "The Number Systems".

**Language Arts-** Ms. Ware's and Mr. Porter's classes will be starting Unit 2, "Focusing on Choices". We will be reading from Kipling in school and students will begin their next novel project.

**Science-** Mrs. Poti's and Mrs. Elias' students will explore the cycling of matter, discuss and classify world resources, and examine human impact on those resources. Students will also decide on a project to research for the Science Fair.

**Social Studies-** Mr. Farbman's and Mrs. Jung's classes will soon be wrapping up Unit II, and moving on to Unit III; "Middle East in the Early Middle Ages". Unit III will begin with the geography of the Arabian Peninsula and the rise of Islam.

**Creative Arts-** The students are working on an illuminated letter design, creating a letter that depicts a time period of choice. The students are using principles of design to arrange the elements of art in their work.

**Life Skills-** Mrs. Bosley's and Mrs. Roberts' classes have finished the study of "Family" and have moved on to "Childcare!" In this unit, students will be learning about the human growth and development of children, planning safe environments for children, understanding the importance of play, and developing some great babysitting tips and tricks.

**Tech Ed-** Inventions and Innovation classes are currently hard at work inventing Jelly Bean Dispensers from recycled materials. Students are working in groups to design, build and test their inventions. The **Comm Tech** class is starting Unit 3 – "Radio Production/Podcasting". Students will be creating their own podcast using Audacity.



**Math-** We have moved into unit #4 in HSA Algebra, solving linear inequalities. Please continue to remind students they can study for any quiz or test using their teacher's webpage which is organized by unit and has interactive activities!

**Language Arts-** Mrs. Bosley's and Ms. DeGroat's classes will be focusing on research projects with Social Studies. Unit 2 will focus on the essential question, "Can a Dream Change the World?"

**Science-** Mrs. Spencer's and Mr. Schulman's classes are completing work on the Variations Module and will begin the Energy Module soon. Students will focus on how reproductive strategies, cell division, and genetics foster variation in organisms. Students will also begin to prepare for their Science Fair projects in early November.

**Social Studies-** Ms. Blakeslee's and Ms. Sayed's students did a great job with their first research projects! Students worked on a joint L.A./Social Studies research project on a Revolutionary Figure. Check out your student's book on their historical figure. We have also completed our Road to Independence Unit and have moved into the Confederation to Constitution unit. This is an important unit as it is the basis for what students will study in 9th grade. Great first term for 8th graders in American Studies - keep up the great work!

Visual Arts- Mrs. Forster's classes are currently in a pencil drawing unit, focusing on rendering techniques and drawing a still life of white objects. 8<sup>th</sup> graders just finished Op Art designs and they are currently displayed in the Art department hallway. Life Skills- Mrs. Gadra's class will focus on techniques to encourage children to behave. We will also discuss how to correct misbehavior in a non-critical way and how to implement consequences when necessary. Students will have the opportunity to hold and work with the baby mannequins in order to master important babysitting skills such as proper techniques for picking up an infant, holding an infant, bottle-feeding, spoonfeeding, and diapering. Please encourage students to respect the mannequins and to treat them as real babies as they are quite

expensive and cannot be easily replaced.



**FRENCH 1** – Mrs. Gadra's students will focus on Chapter 2 grammar and vocabulary this month. Students will learn how to conjugate – "er" verbs and how to express likes and dislikes. Students were introduced to a new vocabulary acquisition technique this week which they must apply when learning all new vocabulary in Chapter 2. Your child should be studying 10-15 minutes every night in addition to any written homework. French 1 is rigorous as it is a high school level course.

**MS. FORSTER'S** students are working on an Egyptian Unit. They learned how to write their names using hieroglyphs and created mummy drawings based on Egyptian history and colored pencil techniques learned in class.
