Top 10 Things Parents Need to Know about the Common Core State Standards

New educational standards, called the Common Core State Standards (CCSS), are being implemented in all Maryland public schools beginning in the 2013-14 school year. The CCSS are a set of consistent, high-quality academic goals in English/language arts (ELA) and mathematics. The standards define the knowledge and skills all students should master by the end of each grade level in order to graduate from high school fully prepared to enter college and the workforce. The CCSS raise the bar for student achievement and will help Maryland build a world-class education system.

Why do we need new educational standards and what do they mean for Maryland students?

Here is a list of the top ten facts about the Common Core State Standards all parents should know.



The goal of the CCSS is college and workforce readiness for all students.

As students progress through the grades, they will build the skills and knowledge they will need to be prepared for college-level coursework and the demands of the 21st century workplace. Students will receive an education that not only leads to a high school diploma, but also to success in college, career, and life after graduation.



The CCSS are not a curriculum and do not tell teachers how to teach.

Educational standards, like the CCSS, provide the foundation for a curriculum — establishing what students need to learn, but not dictating how the standards should be taught. In Maryland, State education experts and teachers have worked to translate the CCSS into a new State curriculum, which will guide instruction of the standards. Teachers will create lesson plans based on the new curriculum and tailor how they teach to the specific needs of their students. The new Maryland Common Core State Curriculum will replace the State's previous curriculum beginning in the 2013-14 school year.

States led the effort to develop the CCSS, **not** the federal government.

The nation's governors and education commissioners collaborated with teachers, researchers, education experts, and members of the higher education and business communities to design and develop the standards. Individual states were able to choose if they wanted to adopt the CCSS and, to date, a total of 46 states (including Maryland) and the District of Columbia have done so.



Better standards call for better assessments.

New tests are being developed to measure the critical content and skills of the CCSS. Maryland is part of a consortium of states, the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC), working together to develop a common set of tests aligned to the CCSS. The PARCC assessments will test writing skills in each grade, as well as critical thinking and problem solving skills. Students will take the new assessments on computers, allowing teachers to see test results quickly and adjust classroom instruction to the needs of their students.

News From the Health Room

Dear Parents/Guardians:

As the registered nurse for Tuscarora High School, I want to take this opportunity to introduce myself.

I am a registered nurse employed by the Frederick County Health Department, School Health Program. I am also the registered nurse at Tuscarora Elementary.

My responsibilities include health appraisals, health counseling, communicable disease prevention, crisis intervention, health education and referrals for health needs. I work closely with school administration, faculty, medical providers and parents to develop plans of care for students with medical needs.

Your child's school has a health room staffed by a health room technician. If your child becomes injured or sick during the school day, basic first aid or medical attention will be provided. The health room technician is a certified nursing assistant and certified medication technician who is trained in first aid and CPR. The health room technician works under my direction and supervision. There are times when I may delegate nursing functions to the health room technician to meet the medical needs of students.

If your child requires a medication or medical treatment during the school day, his/her health care provider must complete the appropriate forms. These forms may be obtained from the health room and at www.fcps.org or http://www.frederickcountymd.gov/index.aspx?nid=2461. As the registered nurse, I am responsible for assuring that medications and treatments can be administered safely during the school day.

New reading assessment provides more data

All students taking 9th and 10th grade English this semester will participate in a new assessment, the Global Scholar reading assessment/pretest. Elementary and middle school students have been taking this test since last year. This computer-based test, which is aligned to our new Common Core standards, challenges students with long reading passages, advanced vocabulary and complex questions. As students get questions correct, the level of difficulty increases. When students get questions wrong, the level of difficulty decreases.

This assessment takes the place of the Scholastic Reading Inventory, which provided limited data and did not mimic the rigorous, authentic reading tasks students face daily in class. It also failed to provide teachers with much data, besides lexile scores. Students take the Global Scholar assessment at the beginning of the course to establish a starting point, and then at the end of the course. Testing results provide teachers and students with valuable information, including a list of the reading and writing skills students have or have not mastered. Using this data will enable teachers to deliver more targeted instruction in the classroom. Because this is a diagnostic assessment, we will use these scores to help measure student growth. Instead of focusing on a single score, we are looking at the progress students make, along with other pieces of data, such as grades, state testing results, etc.

Model United Nations Club

All Tuscarora High students interested in world events and promoting better international understanding through dialogue are invited to join an upcoming Model United Nations simulation. Students from Frederick, Carroll, Montgomery and Washington County public and private high schools usually participate. This will be Tuscarora's eighth year of participation.

Frederick County Public Schools, Hood College, the Frederick UNESCO Center for Peace and the Maryland chapter of the United Nations Association of the USA are sponsoring this Model UN. Guided by rules of the UN, participating students will serve as ambassadors, choosing to represent the strategic interests of one of over 190 member UN countries.

Student ambassadors address real problems facing the world and develop comprehensive approaches to solve them. The student representative brings a student viewpoint to bear in debate. Each student will participate in the conference in such a way that closely represents the perspective of their nation on the topics/issues, assist in preparing resolutions, as well as act as the ambassador of their nation to the United Nations.

Event organizers from Frederick County Public Schools, Hood College and the UNESCO Center for Peace will choose two outstanding student delegates and invite them to attend an event at the UN in New York. Students writing the two best position papers will also receive award recognition.

There are two main events associated with this club:

First: On Saturday, 28 September students will meet at the FCPS Central Office in Frederick for an orientation, and for an overview of this year's topic. This will be a half day meeting ending at around 12-Noon.

(September, October and early November will be spent in research and writingposition papers will be due on Friday, 8 November. No student will be allowed to attend the final meeting without a submitted paper.)

Second: On Saturday, 7 December students will meet at Rosenstock Auditorium, Hood College for the General Assembly Meeting. This will be an all-day meeting ending at 4:30-5pm

Important Information from Food Services

Assisted Meal Program

Each still the preceive a form to complete for the assisted meals program. Please return the form to school as soon as possible wait. If you are unsure as to whether you qualify or not, send the form in for review. If your economic status change the year, you can submit another form. All information is confidential; students cannot see another student's meal status.

At the beginning of the year it will take up to 14 business days to get meal assistance approved so be sure to send money with your student in the meantime. Meals cannot be charged at the high school.

All assisted meals include breakfast and lunch.

Student Accounts

Each student has an account. You can put money on that account via email (www.cafeprepay.com) or you can send in a check or cash. Money on account enables the student to purchase anything we have available. If you wish, you can buy prepaid meals which allows the student to purchase meals only and no ala carte items (snacks). If you chose this option, please write "meals only" in the memo section of your check.

By keeping money on account the student doesn't lose the money, doesn't spend it on his way to school or feel pressured to loan money to another student.

Allergie

If your student has an allergy you must fill in a form with a healthcare provider's signature informing us of what the allergy is, what needs to be removed from the student's diet and what to replace it with. We cannot make meal modifications without this form.

THS Attendance Polices and Reminders

I Believe...that all Titans will come to school every day. But if you cannot, the following are excused absences:

Death in the immediate family

Student illness

Court Summons

Hazardous weather conditions

Work or activity accepted by school

Observance of a religious holiday

State emergency

Health exclusion

Suspension

Lack of authorized transportation (does not include missing the bus)

Other emergency

How do you have an absence marked as excused?

Students should bring a note to school for each absence. Phone calls to attendance must be followed up in writing. Notes should be received by the attendance office within two days of the absence.

What about sports and other school activities?

Students arriving after 9 a.m. or leaving before 12:50 p.m. are not eligible to participate in extra-curricular activities.

How do I check out of school or check in to school?

Students arriving late should sign in at the attendance desk in the front office to receive a pass to class.

Students who need to *leave early* should turn in their note from home at the attendance desk in the front office at the beginning of the school day. Students will be given a pass for their dismissal time. Students should sign out in the front office when they leave.

Students should not call parents for permission to leave early during the school day. The nurse or health technician will contact home if a student is ill. The student's administrator may contact parents on other occasions.

What if I miss more than five (5) days of school?

Students who miss more than five unexcused days of school during a term will fail the term due to attendance.

What if I miss more than ten (10) days of school?

Students who miss more than ten unexcused days of school during the semester will fail the semester due to attendance.

Students who miss more than ten (10) days of school during the school year will be added to the required doctor's note list. Absences will no longer be excused by parent notes. Only official doctor's notes or notes such as a court summons will excuse an absence.
