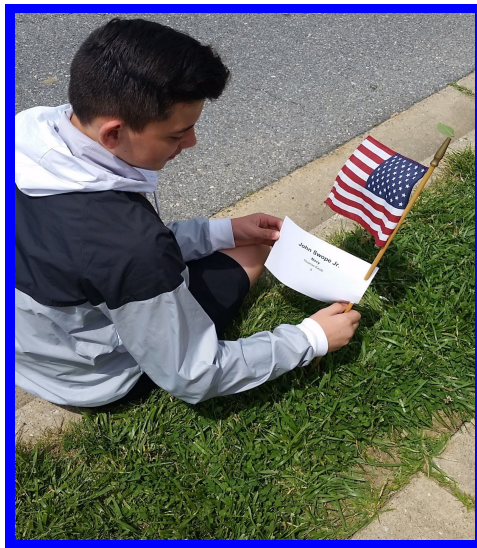


The Walk of Honor
