Middletown Students Taking AP Classes 2019-2020 School Year:

We are excited to announce new resources, AP exam registration processes, and deadlines developed by the AP® Program for the 2019-20 school year.

Here's what you and your student need to know:

- Fall semester AP students will register and pay for AP Exams before November 1.
- Spring semester AP students will register and pay for AP Exams before February 28.
  - This is different than registration in the past and teachers will help facilitate registration through new AP classroom portals.
  - The exam fee isn't changing. However, there is a \$40 fee for late registration and a \$40 cancellation or unused exam fee. All fees (test, late fees, and cancellation fees) will be collected by MHS.
- Students will get personalized feedback through new digital tools that provide daily support for every AP classroom. Teachers will be able to track student performance throughout the year using monthly personal progress checks.

To get ready for the coming school year, please encourage your student to sign up for a College Board account. All College Board programs are connected through one account, so if your student created one for the PSAT/NMSQT®, SAT®, or College Board Opportunity Scholarships, they're all set. They'll just need to have their username and password available.

If your student has registered for an AP course at MHS this year, it is required that students set up (or update) a student College Board account on line at <a href="https://www.collegeboard.org/">https://www.collegeboard.org/</a> Links to this resource are being shared in their AP class during the first week of school.

It is also important for each AP family to understand that students in AP courses will be creating an account in CollegeBoard.org, a third-party online tool that is used to register and practice for AP exams. Creating an account in this system is the only way your child can register for the AP exams. Teachers will help students create/update this account if they have not already done so.
