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Message from the Administrative Team

Dear Parents and Guardians.

I hope that the first month of school started off well for you and your students. While we've had a few challenges (including adjusting to our new security vestibule and our new dismissal procedures), things have overall started out very positively thanks to you, your students, and our school staff. The highlight of the year (of course) has been getting to know your students, who I meet and interact with daily through both an educator and a parent lens. While working in middle schools for more than 20 years could qualify me as a bit of an expert when it comes to the 11-14 year-old age group, the

experience my wife Lynne and I have had navigating our two oldest (of three) children through middle school has proven to be at least as valuable.

I don't know about you, but my wife and I have found parenting middle schoolers to be exhilarating, frustrating, rewarding, hilarious, and humbling--sometimes in the same day or even the same hour! If your children are like our children, you often get the less-than-polished version of them at home. This is of course completely natural and normal--away from peers, adolescents feel more comfortable being vulnerable with you, those who love them most. For a variety of reasons, children tend to be the best versions of themselves when they're with us at school--and it shows what a great job you've done equipping them to be successful in the real world.

As you are working to prepare them for the future, have you noticed that your students resist your advice but listen to advice similar (or maybe even identical) to yours when it's given by another respected adult--maybe a coach, family friend, or teacher? This is pretty typical too, but that doesn't mean it isn't frustrating to us as parents. This reality makes it even more important for us to partner together as a home-school team. If you're seeing your student struggling academically, socially, or personally, please consider reaching out to us to help. We're in this together with you--and you and your children are absolutely worth our time. We see your child's tremendous potential and know that together we can collaborate to ensure that he or she is on the path leading to success. Feel free to contact us at any time and we will be more than happy to work with you to determine the right plan to help your child.

Good attendance leads to success and boosts graduation. Our school goal is 96%.





Math News

7th Grade common core students will be finishing up with Unit 1 Rational Number Operations next week and begin working on unit 2 which involves solving problems by applying all operations of rational numbers.

7th Grade accelerated students finished up with Unit 1 this week and will begin unit 2 on Squares, Cubes & the Pythagorean Theorem.

Be sure to check Schoology on a regular basis and use posted class notes as a resource for homework and preparation for assessments.

Science Department News

Students learn science by acquiring knowledge and constructing explanations of natural phenomena. Then they test those explanations and communicate their findings both in oral and written forms.

Through this process, students develop a deep understanding of science that combines knowledge and facts with reasoning and critical thinking.

At every grade in middle school, students will complete four units of scientific study. Below are classroom updates from all three grade levels.

Grade 6

Sixth grade students are conducting a series of investigations to model molecular motion and particle positioning in solids, liquids, and gases. Additionally, they are examining how adding or removing thermal energy impacts these properties. Grade 7

Seventh grade students are studying Chemistry and Matter. Explorations in this unit begin with students developing models to describe the atomic composition of simple molecules and extended structures. For a full description of this NGSS standard go to:

Grade 8

Eighth grade students started the Biotic Diversity unit with the key question: How can evidence demonstrate connections between organisms of the past and present? Students are applying scientific ideas to construct an explanation for the anatomical similarities and differences among modern organisms and between modern and fossil organisms to infer evolutionary relationships. Social Studies News

The Social Studies Department has enjoyed getting to know your children over the last month and we are looking forward to working with each of them this school year! All grade levels will begin their first county benchmark assessment DBQ (document based question) in the coming weeks. These assessments are not recorded in the grade book, but serve as a pre-assessment of their historical analysis and writing skills, which we will develop throughout the school year. If you have any questions please contact your child's teacher.

8th grade is currently studying Early British Actions and the Boston Massacre. Students will begin their first county benchmark in October.

7th grade is currently completing the first county benchmark, which is looking at the Fall of Rome's impact on European society.

6th grade is currently teaching the Rise of Civilizations. Students are studying geography and how it impacted the development of early civilizations. Students will begin their first county benchmark next week.
