Johns Hopkins University - Engineering Innovation:

Given the current COVID-19 situation, Johns Hopkins University has made the difficult decision to cancel all in-person classes through June 30th. Because of this, Engineering Innovation will not be offered this summer. This action was not taken lightly but was executed to ensure the health and safety of our students, staff, and their families.

Students who will have completed a year of both biology and a year of physics, prior to the start of the program, are encouraged to enroll in our fully online course for high school students, Biomedical Engineering Innovation (BMEI). Students who earn an A or B in the course will receive three (3) college credits from Johns Hopkins University.

BMEI introduces biomedical engineering to high school students by (1) modeling biological systems and designing experiments to test those models and (2) introducing engineering principles to solve design problems that are biological, physiological, and/or medical.

Academic pre-requisites are:

- Have As and Bs in their high school math and science classes
- Successfully completed Algebra II
- Successfully completed a course where the trigonometric functions are taught. To meet the trigonometry prerequisite students, must be able to use the trigonometric functions and be comfortable applying the laws of sines and cosines to non-right angle triangles.
- Successfully completed Physics and Biology

BMEI will be offered during the following sessions:

- Summer 2020 10-week (May 26 to July 31, 2020)
- Summer 2020 Term 1 (June 1 to July 3, 2020)
- Summer 2020 Term 2 (June 22 to July 31, 2020)
- Fall 2020 (August 31 to December 7, 2020)

Runaway Child Prevention - Resources for Parents

Over the past 6 weeks, the Frederick Police Department (FPD) has investigated multiple reports of missing juvenile females. A common thread in these cases is that the missing girl leaves home without permission for several days to see a friend, and attempts to keep her location a secret. These cases are assigned to detectives, who attempt to track down the missing person through various investigative techniques.

It is likely that social distancing can be hard for teens who feel cut off from friends, and as a result, they may feel sad, depressed, hopeless, nervous, or angry. Selective Service Registration

A reminder that under federal law, men living in the U.S., citizen and non-citizens alike, are required by law to register with Selective Service at 18 years old.

Men who register with Selective Service remain eligible for federal student financial aid, state-funded student financial aid, federal employment, state employment, job training under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, security clearances, and U.S. citizenship for immigrant men. For more information, see Why Register. Selective Service accepts early registrations as young as 17 years and 3 months.

- Work permits are required for all minors under the age of 18 to work in the State of Maryland. Click here for application: https://www.dllr.state.md.us/ChildWorkPermit/web/content/Home.aspx
- Work permits are not issued to minors under the age of 14. (Unless the child is a model, performer or entertainer with a <u>special permit</u> (<u>Word</u>); en español (<u>Solicitud para permiso especial de trabajo(Word</u>). Special permits are issued only by the Commissioner's Office.)
- Work permits are issued by the Division of Labor and Industry.
- Work permits are not issued until the minor has been offered a job.
- If the minor changes jobs, a new work permit must be obtained.
- Employers are strongly encouraged to keep work permits on file for three years.
