4. Applicant must have earned at least one (1) varsity letter in each of the two (2) sports
5. Applicant must complete and include the scholar/essay
6. Applicant must have a letter of recommendation from the high school athletic administrator/director
7. School athletic director must be an NIAAA member and a member of their respective state athletic administrators/directors association (**MSADA**)
8. The principal or athletic director must sign the application to ensure that the academic information submitted is accurate
