What is a Teen Academy?

Entrance Requirements

Candidates must meet the following criteria:

- U.S. Citizen and residence of Delaware or Maryland.
- High school students (16 to18 years old) at the time of Teen Academy.
- GPA of 2.5 or higher.
- Obtain permission from a parent or guardian.
- Obtain reference from school principal, teacher, or guidance counselor.
- Currently enrolled in an accredited high school or home schooled in Delaware or Maryland.
- Complete an application and one page essay.
- Agree to attend the entire three day session.

• Registration begins at 7:45 a.m. and will conclude approximately at 4:00 p.m. on predetermined dates.

- Students must provide their own transportation to/from the FBI Baltimore Division.
- Secure parking is available.
