General Information

FCPS, Out of District SY 23-24

The FCPS Department of Student Services is now receiving requests for student enrollments in schools outside of the student's home attendance district for the 2023-2024 school year. Requests to enroll in a school that is not a student's home school district must be made by parents/legal guardians. Guidelines for requests are outlined in FCPS Regulation [400-15](#).

Parents/guardians must apply for an out-of-district enrollment annually. Therefore, if your child is currently attending a school out of your attendance district, you must complete and submit an application if you would like to request that your child remain at that school.

If a school's enrollment is over capacity, it is necessary to restrict out-of-district student enrollments in that school. This includes students whose daycare providers are located outside their assigned attendance area.

Out-of-district requests submitted as the result of school redistricting by the Board of Education may be denied.

Parents or guardians who wish to request an out-of-district enrollment for the 2023-2024 school year must apply by completing the out-of-district application. The applications are available in [English](#) and [Spanish](#). The application can also be found online at www.fcps.org under the "For Families and Students" tab. **The application window is open until March 1, 2023.** Families will be notified of the decision by April 1, 2023.

Maryland's priority deadline for the 2023-2024 academic year is March 1st! It is important students submit their FAFSA by March 1st so they may be considered for [state financial aid](#) in addition to [Federal Student Aid \(FSA\)](#). Students can still submit their FAFSA/MSFAA after March 1st, but they would miss out on consideration for most state aid programs, such as the [Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship](#).

There are state financial aid programs available for students pursuing specific Workforce Development programs, students are encouraged to submit a FAFSA/MSFAA even if they are not enrolled in a credit program.

WHAT IS 2-1-1?

2-1-1 is a quick and easy way to find information and get referrals for thousands of programs and services across Maryland.

WHO SHOULD CALL? Anyone of any age can call 2-1-1 at any time. 2-1-1 call specialists are trained to assist people dealing with all kinds of challenges including housing, utility shutoffs, family crisis, financial, legal, employment, and other problems.

2-1-1 is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year in over 180 languages. 2-1-1 is also accessible for the deaf and hard of hearing through Maryland Relay (dial 7-1-1).

DOES IT COST ANYTHING? 2-1-1 services are free. Your telephone provider's long-distance rates may apply if you are calling one of our local numbers from out of the area. If you are calling from a cell phone, air time and other cell phone charges may apply. If you or a loved one need help or support, pick up the phone and dial 2-1-1 today.

Comcast Internet is providing a low cost high speed internet service to families that have a financial need. To qualify for the program families must:

- Have at least one child who qualifies for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) or can provide documentation outlined in the 'Acceptable Eligibility Documentation' section.
- Not have outstanding debt to Comcast that is less than a year old. Families with outstanding debt more than one year old may still be eligible.
- Live in an area where Comcast Internet service is available but have not subscribed to Comcast Internet service within the last 90 days, where applicable.

With the physical facility closed, **MHA's Walk-in Behavioral Health Services has moved to an online telehealth platform**. MVA Forms- LEARNER'S PERMIT VERIFICATION FORM

Is your student applying for an MVA learner's permit? Students applying are required to have a Verification of Identity and/or School Attendance form completed by the school.

- You must give the school 24 hours to process your student's MVA form.
- Section A, of the form, must be completed and signed by both the student and a parent before bringing it to the school, for verification.
- Once the verification is done the form will be placed in an envelope, sealed and put in the front office for your student to pick up.
- Do not open the envelope, it must be opened by the MVA only.

Runaway Child Prevention - Resources for Parents

Over the past several months, the Frederick Police Department (FPD) has investigated multiple reports of missing juvenile females. A common thread in these cases is that the missing girl leaves home without permission for several days to see a friend, and attempts to keep her location a secret. These cases are assigned to detectives, who attempt to track down the missing person through various investigative techniques.

It is likely that social distancing can be hard for teens who feel cut off from friends, and as a result, they may feel sad, depressed, hopeless, nervous, or angry. Selective Service Registration

A reminder that under federal law, men living in the U.S., citizen and non-citizens alike, are required by law to register with Selective Service at 18 years old.

Men who register with Selective Service remain eligible for federal student financial aid, state-funded student financial aid, federal employment, state employment, job training under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, security clearances, and U.S. citizenship for immigrant men. For more information, see [Why Register](#). Selective Service accepts early registrations as young as 17 years and 3 months.

The Selective Service System has not now, or in the past, collected or shared any information which would indicate a man's immigration status, either documented or undocumented. Students can register on-line at <https://www.sss.gov/>
