

## **Art Updates**

#### L4L

- Students will learn about positive and negative space.
- Students will explore ways to show perspective in a 2-D artwork.

#### **PreK**

- Getting acquainted with the art room.
- Students will be learning about the art elements texture and color.

#### <u>Kindergarten</u>

- Students will be learning about the art element texture.
- Students will learn about the art element color and the color wheel.
- Students will create a seasonal artwork using different art tools & media.

#### 1st Grade

- Students will learn about the art subject matter landscape.
- Students will experiment with the use of <u>warm</u> and <u>cool colors</u> in their artwork.
- Students will be identifying patterns in works of art and everyday life. Using the art principle <u>pattern</u> in your own work of art.

#### 2nd Grade

- Students will learn about the art element texture.
- Students will explore and use a variety of art tools.
- Students will learn about the art element <u>shape</u> and identifying <u>geometric</u> and <u>organic shapes</u>.

#### 3rd Grade

- Students will learn to identify the directional lines <u>horizontal</u>, <u>vertical</u>, and <u>diagonal</u>.
- Students will use a variety of art media and art tools.
- Students will learn about the art element of value.

#### 4th Grade

- Students will learn about positive and negative space.
- Students will be introduced to <u>tertiary</u> colors.

## Library Media Updates

#### **Book Return**

Please make sure your child brings back their library books. Students who have more than five overdue library books will be unable to take more home until some are returned. Books can be returned any day of the week. Please remind your student to put the book in the library book bin located in his or her classroom.

#### **Media Instruction**

During the month of November, we will discuss the importance of digital etiquette, digital citizenship, and online safety. Since online usage is such a substantial part of our lives it is important that we discuss how we should behave online. We will discuss online bullying and brainstorm ways we can be an upstander in these situations. We will talk about the difference between private and personal information and how students should be careful regarding what they share online. Private information is information that can be used to identify you (i.e. birthdate, full name, address, phone number, and social security number). Personal information is information that many people also share (i.e. favorite sports, food, music etc).

In all grades we will discuss how rules keep us safe. Just like we have rules at home, at school, and in our neighborhood we also need rules to keep us safe online.

Please reinforce these three rules regarding how children access the internet at home:

- 1) Ask permission before going online
- 2) Use websites for kids
- 3) Only talk to people you know

Every year, I am always surprised at how many students tell me that they have discussions with strangers while playing online games. Many students tell me that they share their names, ages, and where they live with their online friends. Out of an abundance of caution, please monitor your child's devices and who

they are talking to online. It is important that they keep information about themselves private and do not disclose information that would help a stranger steal their identity or find them.

# **MUSIC**



## Music Updates

The Music Department is rolling with singing, playing instruments and movement!

Want to become familiar with what your student(s) will be learning in music throughout the year?

#### <u>Kindergarten</u>

- Students will continue to learn rules, routines, and procedures of the music room.
- Students will identify a steady beat through singing, playing instruments, and movement.
- Students will also start to identify their four voices (whisper, talk, shout, and sing) through class activities.
- Students will be introduced to high/low pitches in music through singing.

#### PreK:

- Students will continue to create movement to various music genres.
- Students will be introduced to the xylophone this month.

#### Learning for Life

 Students will practice making music through singing, dancing, listening, and playing instruments.

#### 1st Grade

- Students will sing, play music games, use classroom instruments, and identify/practice steady beat.
- Students will also review their four voices in various musical activities.
- Students will be introduced to quarter and eighth notes as well as quarter rest through various musical activities.

#### **2nd Grade**

- Students will review quarter notes, eighth notes, and quarter rest through various musical activities.
- After reviewing, students will learn about the half note and how to successfully play an ostinato.
- Students will participate in various singing activities that include the following pitches- sol, mi, la, do and re.
- Students will be able to visually identify parts of the music staff.

#### <u>3rd Grade</u>

- Students will continue to sing, play music games, use classroom instruments and practice various rhythms.
- After reviewing, students will learn about the dotted half note, whole note, half rest, whole rest, and sixteenth notes through various musical activities.
- Students will participate in various singing activities that include the following pitches- sol, mi, la, do, re, low la, and low sol...
- Students will be able to visually identify parts of the music staff.
- Students will be able to identify pitches on the staff that are located a step, skip, or leap apart.

#### 4th and 5th Grade

- Students will continue to sing, play music games, use classroom instruments, and practice various rhythms.
- After reviewing, students will learn about dotted quarter/eighth note/eighth rest combinations and syncopation through musical activities.
- Students will be identifying pitches that are a leap apart on the music staff.
- Students will have practice identifying notes on the music staff through various musical activities.
