

Art Updates

L4L

- Students will practice showing the art principle <u>value</u>.
- Students will explore ways to show perspective in a <u>2-D</u> artwork.
- Students will create a winter <u>landscape</u>.

PreK

• Students will be learning about the art elements texture and color.

<u>Kindergarten</u>

- Students will be learning about the art element texture.
- Students will learn about the art element of shape.
- Students will create seasonal artwork using different art tools & media.

1st Grade

- Students will learn about the art subject matter <u>landscape</u>.
- Students will show their understanding of using <u>primary colors</u> to mix <u>secondary colors</u>.
- Students will learn about and create their own portrait.
- Students will learn about the art principle pattern.

2nd Grade

- Students will continue to learn about the art element <u>texture</u>.
- Students will explore and use a variety of art tools.
- Students will learn about the art element <u>shape</u> and identifying <u>geometric</u> and <u>organic shapes</u>.

- Students will create a <u>landscape</u> with a <u>foreground</u>, <u>middleground</u>, and <u>background</u>.
- Students will create a seasonal landscape showing their understanding of <u>perspective</u>.
- Students will learn about the art element of value.

4th Grade

- Students will learn about positive and negative space.
- Students will practice using strategies to show <u>perspective</u> in a <u>2-D</u> work of art.
- Students will continue to explore the differences between <u>abstract</u> and realistic art.

5th Grade

- Students will learn about the art principle of unity.
- Students will learn about <u>Monochromatic</u> and Analogous color schemes.

 Students will show their understanding of the art principle unity and focal point.

Book Return

Please make sure your child brings back their library books. Students who have more than five overdue library books will be unable to take more home until some are returned. Books can be returned any day of the week. Please remind your student to put the book in the library book bin located in his or her classroom.

Media Instruction

During the month of December we will learn about coding and computational thinking. We will use children's literature to learn about coding, robots, and various inventors to gain a greater understanding of the topics. Students in grades k-5 will learn directional coding through a variety of ways depending on their grade level.

- **K-2** We will begin by "coding" Mrs. Houston with directional commands to go from one area of the Media Center to the other. Students will then use directional commands to code stuffed animals and one another. Students will also have opportunities to use the Code-A-Pillar and Beebots to practice their skills.
- **3-5-** We will begin our coding unit by learning how coding, computational thinking, and robots are used in day to day life. We will learn how to use the Beebots with the <u>Beebot Online Emulator</u>. Students will then work in teams to use the Beebots to complete a task. Students will also use the Ozobots. We will study the different command cards and create a track for the Ozobot to follow. Lastly, we will end our unit with students interacting with specific programs on the <u>Hour of Code</u> website.

Music Updates

<u>Kindergarten</u>

- Students will experience various holiday songs through singing and with instruments.
- Students will be introduced to high/low pitches in music through singing.

PreK:

- Students will continue to create movement to various music genres.
- Students will use their singing voices to explore various holiday songs.

Learning for Life

 Students will practice making music through singing, dancing, listening, and playing instruments.

1st Grade

- Students will experience various holiday songs through singing and with instruments.
- Students will be introduced to cumulative form through stories and listening to music.

2nd Grade

- After reviewing, students will learn about the half note and how to successfully play an ostinato to various songs including some holiday ones!
- Students will participate in various singing activities that include the following pitches- sol, mi, la, do and re.

3rd Grade.

- Students will continue to identify pitches on the staff that are located a step, skip, or leap apart.
- Students will experience various holiday songs through singing and with instruments.
- Students will have practice composing the notes B, A, and G on the music staff.

4th Grade

- Students will have practice identifying notes on the music staff through various musical activities.
- Students will experience various holiday songs with instruments.

5th Grade

- Students will have practice identifying notes on the music staff (treble and bass) through various musical activities.
- Students will experience various holiday songs with instruments.
- Students will be introduced to the musical concept of theme and variations with listening activities.
