# **ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS**


Students in grades 3-5 have been working on building their keyboarding skills using a resource called Typing Agent. Grades 4 and 5 students are expected to demonstrate sufficient command of keyboarding skills to type a minimum of one to two pages in a single setting (one page in grade 4 and two pages in grade 5). Additionally, grades 3 through 5 students will be asked to type their response on MCAP assessments including Math, Science and ELA assessments. Our goal is for students to be able to focus more on WHAT they are typing

versus HOW they type it when providing evidence of learning, expressing ideas, and responding to standardsaligned questions in all content areas.

To help support your child, encourage them if they are using a keyboard to use the proper position and home row so that they can work at looking at the screen, instead of at their fingers when typing.

The **home row** is where your fingers will rest in order to reach all of the keys. The home keys are where you place your fingers when you are learning to type. The home keys include A, S, D, and F on the left of the keyboard, and J, K, L, and; (semicolon) on the right of the keyboard.

If you would like your child to access Typing Agent at home for some additional practice, they can follow the instructions below for home access:
