- Students will review the colors families primary, secondary, warm, and cool.

- Students will continue to learn about the art principle <u>pattern</u> and <u>repetition</u>.

2nd Grade

Author Appreciation

My goal is for all students this year to grow in their enjoyment of quality picture books. So many of the picture books in our library allow students to understand themselves, others, and our world in a more vivid way. Together, we will explore quality children's authors and illustrators (i.e. Eric Carle, Tomie dePaola, Matt De La Pena, etc) and uncover what makes them outstanding contributors to children's literature.

Grades 3-5

Research

Our students have more information at their fingertips than any previous generation. It is important for students to learn how to distinguish if the information they are consuming is trustworthy. We will use the T.R.A.P.P. method (Trustworthy, Relevance, Authority, Accuracy, and Purpose) to determine the reliability of multiple information sources. We will also learn how to evaluate resources based on their research needs. We will compare and contrast books and databases to determine the most effective information resources for specific research topics.

PreK

• In February, PreK students will explore long and short through movement, singing, and playing instruments.

Learning for Life

 In February, students will sing, dance, and play a variety of classroom instruments.

<u>Kindergarten</u>

 In February, students will explore melodic direction through instruments and with their singing voices.

1st Grade

- Ms. Gearhart's classes will identify and perform solfege using so, mi, and la.
- Mrs. Slick's classes will perform and create their own patterns using quarter rests, quarter notes, and eighth notes.

2nd Grade

- Ms. Gearhart's classes will learn about expressive elements i.e. tempo and dynamics.
- Mrs. Slick's classes will be completing Chinese New Year composition projects.

3rd Grade

- Ms. Gearhart's classes will learn about expressive elements i.e. tempo and dynamics.
- Mrs. Slick's classes will be introduced to expressive elements (tempo, dynamics)

4th Grade

- Ms. Gearhart's classes will learn about expressive elements i.e. tempo and dynamics.
- Mrs. Slick's classes will review expressive elements from last year (tempo, dynamics) and complete a blues style composition.

5th Grade

- Ms. Gearhart's classes will learn about expressive elements i.e. tempo and dynamics, and engage in repertoire on the recorder.
- Mrs. Slick's classes will complete a Jazz musician project and review expressive elements.

Kindergarten, 1st Grade and 2nd Grade

Striking with Implements

- Students will work on various striking skills. Equipment being used will include Hockey Sticks, Mini-Hockey Sticks, Foam Paddles, and Hard Paddles.
- Students will strike a variety of objects to work on hand eye coordination and proper skill patterns.
- Students will use these skills to participate in a variety of partner based, and small sided games.

3rd Grade, 4th Grade and 5th Grade

- Students will participate in a Floor Hockey unit to work on skills including dribbling with a long handled implement, passing and shooting (striking), as well as offensive and defensive strategies.
- Students will work on their skills in order to build up to a culminating event which is a Floor Hockey Tournament. Students will work on safe play, sportsmanship, and teamwork skills.

PreK and Learning for Life

- Students will continue to work on the Young Athletes program and skills including balance, pathways, and levels.
- Students will participate in large group games allowing them to learn and practice how to play with a large group.
