# Kindergarten-Second Grade

During our Media Classes, students are continuing to learn about prominent Americans. In February we learned about outstanding African Americans for Black History Month and in March we will learn about remarkable women for Women's History Month. We will discuss the importance of studying people who have persevered through trials, hardships, and society's expectations at the time.

#### Third Grade

We are finishing up our research projects on our favorite pets. Students have the choice of presenting through a Google Slide or on a poster. Students thought of reasons their animal would make the best pet and were asked to find facts from two different sources to support their reasons. This assignment requires students to read for information, take notes, integrate information from two sources, and share their research in a meaningful way. Together, we have persevered through a challenging task. I look forward to seeing their final projects.

#### Fourth Grade

Students have chosen a prominent African American or woman to study in celebration of Black History Month and Women's History Month. Students are taking notes from a variety of sources. They are gathering information to answer their personal research questions using who, what, where, when, why and how. Students will have an opportunity to create a Google Slideshow or a poster to share their work.

#### Fifth Grade

Students have been researching inventions in their classrooms and in the Media Center. In their classrooms, students were expected to take their research notes and write a research paper on inventions. In the Media Center, students were expected to take their notes and create a Google Slideshow and present it to the class. We are finishing up our presentations and will then begin learning about prominent figures to support Black History Month and Women's History Month.

# Music Updates

## **PreK**

 PreK students will explore steady beat through singing, movement, stories, and instruments.

#### Learning for Life

 In March, students will sing, dance, and play a variety of classroom instruments

#### <u>Kindergarten</u>

- In March, Ms. Gearhart's classes will engage with classroom instruments categorized by method of sound production: hit, shake, and scrape.
- Mrs. Slick's classes will explore musical opposites (loud/quiet, fast/slow) through stories, movement, instrument playing, and singing. We will also take a look at children's literature and perform accompaniments to various stories.

## 1st Grade

- In March, Ms. Gearhart's classes will engage in a unit on rhythm.
- Mrs. Slick's classes will perform and create their own patterns using quarter rests, quarter notes, and eighth notes. We will also take a look at children's literature and perform accompaniments to various stories.

## 2nd Grade

- In March, Ms. Gearhart's classes will engage in a unit on the Classroom Instrument Families: wood, metal, shaker, scrape, and membranes.
- Mrs. Slick's classes will be exploring dynamics and tempo through movement, singing, and instrument playing.

# 3rd Grade

- In March, Ms. Gearhart's classes will engage in a unit on the Orchestra Instrument Families: string, brass, woodwind, and percussion.
- Mrs. Slick's classes will continue our dynamics unit and then move onto the Orchestra family unit.
- ALL 3rd graders will begin learning the Soprano Recorder in April.

## 4th Grade

- In March, Ms. Gearhart's classes will begin a listening journal incorporating: instrument families and musical styles.
- Ms. Gearhart's 4th graders will begin a unit on the Soprano Recorder in late March. If your child is in Mrs. Austin's or Mr. Miller's class AND they need to purchase a recorder, please login to <u>School Cash</u> Online.
- Mrs. Slick's classes will continue with their dynamics unit and start our ukulele unit.

## 5th Grade

- In March, Ms. Gearhart's classes will begin a listening journal incorporating: instrument families, musical styles, major and minor tonalities, and musical form.
- Mrs. Slick's classes will finish our dynamic unit and then move onto our Orchestra family unit.

## Kindergarten, 1st Grade and 2nd Grade

Introduction to Jump Rope

- Students will learn the basic steps on how to Jump Rope.
- Students will practice Jump Rope skills using Skip it's, regular and long ropes, as well as Hula-Hoops
- Students will identify parts of the body that get stronger as a result of jumping rope.

#### Striking with Hands

- Students will learn to strike an object with their hands. This could include balloons, volleyballs, or beach balls.
- Students will strike the objects with various parts of their hands. This includes palms, fingers, back of hand, wrist, etc.

# 3rd Grade, 4th Grade and 5th Grade

Jump Rope

- Students will participate in a new version of Jump Rope called " Jump Rope Ninja."
- Students will practice with normal size ropes for individual jumping, as well as long rope jumping with partners.
- Students will make connections with jumping rope and cardiorespiratory endurance.

# Volleyball

- Students will work on volleyball skills including the bump, set, serve and spike.
- Students will participate in small sided games to practice volleyball skills
- Students will be introduced to net games.

## PreK and Learning for Life

- Students will continue to work on the Young Athletes Program.
- Students will begin experiential learning with Jump Roping skills. This includes individual and partner activities.
