CURRICULUM UPDATES ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Over the next three weeks, our class will build their knowledge about traditional stories, with a focus on story genres, such as tall tales, trickster tales, and legends. We will read texts and view videos about what lessons you can learn from characters in traditional tales. Children will also write an expository essay to tell why it is important to consider the results of their actions.

Bring it home!

- Set aside time daily for your child to share with you what he or she is learning.
- Ask about the texts your child is reading and what he or she has learned from them.

Explore the Genre - The genre focus in this module is traditional stories. Discuss with your child the characteristics of traditional stories, such as they often teach a lesson and include characters that are animals or have exaggerated abilities. Ask your child to read to you each day and make time to read together.

Build VocabularyUse these ideas to help your child build a rich vocabulary.

The Big Idea: Reinforce the topic words *trickster*, *shrewd*, exaggeration, and legendary in everyday conversations with your child. Use prompts like these: Name some characters that are tricksters. Describe something that is legendary.

What Does It Mean? Have your child keep a growing list of the Critical Vocabulary words. Quiz each other on their meanings.

Word Hunt Look for words with the suffixes –ion, –ity, –ty and prefixes mis–, pre–, dis– in books and online texts.

MATH: Unit 4 - Fractions, Decimals, and Measurement Addition, Subtraction, and Multiplication

In this unit, students have opportunities to:

- Compare fractions with unlike denominators.
- Add and subtract fractions with mixed numbers.
- Multiply a fraction by a whole number.
- Write decimals as fractions and write fractions as decimals.
- Compare decimals.
- Solve problems about measurement.
- Agree or disagree with ideas in discussion about fractions, decimals, and measurement and explain why.

Social Studies: Resistance, Colonization, and European Expansion in North America (1600 – 1750)

In this unit students explore the compelling question, "How did British colonization in North America impact the lives of people?" The unit begins by examining the motivations, challenges and successes of the colonists in Jamestown, Plymouth and St. Mary's City. Students will explain how colonization impacted the American Indians as more Europeans came to settle in North America. Next, students will analyze how geography influenced the economic development of the different North American colonial regions. Finally, students will learn about the methods and motivations by which freedom was granted or denied for various groups in colonial North America. The rise of slavery in the colonies will be explored as well as various forms of resistance used by enslaved people.

PATHS UPDATES

In Paths we will work on **Feelings** by:

- Teaching children that everyone experiences feelings.
- To help children identify, understand and discuss basic feelings and their causes.
- To increase children's vocabulary regarding emotions and emotional states (so children can express their feelings)
