We monitor attendance closely at OES because there is a strong correlation between school success and regular attendance. When students are absent they miss valuable instruction. We understand that children need to miss school at times for legitimate reasons, but we appreciate parents supporting us by ensuring that students are present whenever possible. As part of attendance, we monitor late arrivals and early dismissals. When students come in late, they miss directions and instructions. This causes interruptions to learning for others because the teacher must often stop to catch up the late student. Students who come in late or leave early on a regular basis, continually miss instruction in the same content area. This can impact academic progress. If there is an issue that is causing your child to miss school, please let us know so we can provide support. Thank you for all you do to help your children to be successful, including ensuring that they attend school on a regular basis.

#### **Counselor's Corner**

Finally, it's starting to feel like Spring is actually here!! With Term 4 right around the corner, here are some things that have been going on in the "Counselor's Corner"

· Guidance Lessons are almost all completed for Term 3:

- This term I visited Pre-K and Kindergarten classes and talked about Tattling vs. Telling with the help of Maurice Sendak's "Seven Little Monsters". We learned that Tattling occurs when you are trying to get someone IN to trouble, and Telling is when you are trying to keep someone safe or OUT of trouble.
- First grade created the "ABCs of Careers" with me ideas generated ranged from Archeologists to Zoo Keepers, Quilt Makers to Bakers, but we also got some new favorites, including Drone Pilot, Kangaroo trainer, and Igloo Maker. And who knows the jobs our kids hold someday may very well not even exist today!
- Second graders explored the world of work with the help of the PAWS in Jobland Program this time. We
  talked about typical things we do in a normal school day, such as math, writing, working in groups,
  presenting, even singing, and then explored eight different random jobs to see how many of those daily
  tasks will be used in the jobs we might have some day.
- In 3rd grade we are having fun thinking about what jobs we could have some day with the help of the book "How Santa Got His Job." Hmmm... never really thought about that: was Santa always "Santa", or did he work through a few unsuccessful job attempts before that?...
- What exactly IS "success"? Fourth graders explored the "Keys to Success" by discussing report cards and how much valuable feedback we get from them and NOT just from our grades.
- Who really determines your grades on your report card? Teacher or student?
- What are successful work behaviors?
- What are your school related academic goals?

One of the main "takeaways": those "Personal and Social Development" & "Demonstrates Effort" scores are a GREAT indicator of how successful we will be – whether it's the grades on our report cards now or in our future careers.

- In 5th grade we talked about our Reputations -
- To understand how reputations good and bad affect everyone
- How our character Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Caring, and Citizenship
   truly IS a huge part of the reputations we create for ourselves
- How gossip can harm friendships and potentially our reputations as well especially if WE are the ones spreading the gossip...
- Lunch groups for Term 3 are wrapping up and Term 4 groups will begin on Tuesday, April 11th. If you are interested in your child participating in a lunch group with me, please contact me using the contact information below.
