MUSIC NOTES

From learning your ABC's to memorizing your math facts, music has always been a powerful teaching tool. Developing an understanding of musical concepts such as rhythm, melody, harmony, timbre, history, culture, and much more can help students make connections outside of music class.

Here is a summary of musical concepts and activities happening in our music program during term 4!

GRADES K, 1- Students are exploring, practicing, and performing a variety of contrasting musical concepts including *high/low*, *loud/soft, fast/slow, and same/different.* Activities such as singing, playing classroom instruments, movement, stories, and listening enable students to explore the contrasting musical concepts listed above.

GRADES 2, 3, 4, AND 5 - *Tone color* is the unique sound that each instrument produces. Students will explore the concept *tone color* by identifying various instruments by sight, sound, and the methods of how each instrument produces its sound. Students will expand on the concept of *tone color* by experiencing and exploring the names, families, and sounds of various orchestra instruments.

Students in grades 2 through 5 are also learning and performing various **song forms**. Common song forms include **verse/refrain, call/response, AB, ABA, Rondo, theme and variations**, and others! Familiarizing students with various song forms can help students identify patterns in the music and songs in their everyday lives.

4[™] AND 5[™] GRADE CHORUS – Chorus members were excited to perform on stage at the High School for the "Empty Bowls Benefit Concert." Soon, they will be singing the "Star Spangled Banner" at a Frederick Keys baseball game, May 10th. Spring Chorus will conclude with their final performance, an evening concert on May 14th.

4[™] AND 5[™] GRADE BAND AND ORCHESTRA -
