It has been a great start to a new school year at Glade Elementary School. I appreciate your support of our Back to School Nights last week and the opportunity it afforded for you to meet your child's teacher and hear about plans for learning and communication in the coming year.

I also appreciate the hard work and kindness of our students, staff, and families as we continue to support and live our school motto each and every day. Work Hard, Be Kind is our motto here at Glade, and both parts of the motto are equally important in continuing our school improvement efforts.

Speaking of school improvement, our PTA (Parent Teacher Association) is a significant contributor to the success of our school. Being a member of PTA is a statement of support for your child and for our school. Please become a member if you have not already.

Our PTA organizes and supports a whole range of efforts in our school, from cultural arts programs to family events including Trunk or Treat, Family Movie Nights, Dads 'n' Donuts, Moms 'n' Muffins, and many, many more as you can see from the school year calendar above. Our PTA also provides classroom magazines to support our literacy program at a cost of \$3,500 a year, as well as provide student agendas for Grades 3-5. I know how difficult it is, as the parent of two high-school children myself, to manage all of the communication and paperwork that we as parents contend with at the beginning of each school year. We organize the school year calendar over the summer for this reason, so that we may provide you with as much information as proactively as possible.

There will be many, many opportunities to be involved in our school this year. We love having you involved in our school because it supports our students, your children. We aim to provide a climate of respect, civility, and welcome, and a culture of high-expectations and academic achievement.

Here are 5 important ways that you can help your student to succeed at school:

1. Read with your child every night. Enjoy it and encourage it.
2. Teach your child positive ways to express feelings. Our PATHS program in pre-k through 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade will support you in this effort. We will be teaching students to recognize how they feel and give them vocabulary to identify their feelings as well as how to develop positive and socially acceptable ways to express feelings. Recognizing the difference between mad/upset/angry/frustrated is important. Knowing how to express the feeling without harm to self or others is equally important. We are excited to develop this aspect of our school culture together with you.
3. Provide your child with some downtime as well as a structured routine for doing homework.
4. Teach positive self-advocacy skills. Who do I talk to when I need help? What do I do if someone is treating me without respect? What is the difference between bullying and teasing?
5. Play board games and sing songs. Play is the work of childhood. And it’s a great way to relax. We all need to do that from time to time.

We appreciate all of you here at Glade Elementary School. It will be a great year!

If you have made any address changes because you moved, please provide a new proof of residence (a copy of a property tax bill, gas bill, electric bill, water/sewer bill or a signed current lease/rental agreement, no phone/cable bills). We cannot change that information in the system and therefore student transportation could be disrupted.

This month we have been focusing on our school motto **Work Hard - Be Kind** and discussing in depth what it means to be **SPOT** on at Glade. Our school rules are:

Show Respect to ourselves, others and property

Positive Attitude to learning and to others

Own your actions and words

Take pride in your work

We also kicked-off year two of Leader in Me with a school-wide event where students traveled through stations that represented each of our 7 Habits. One new thing this year is we have Buddy Classes where younger classes (K/1/2) are "partnered" with an older class (3/4/5) for the year. If you ever want to see something amazing....watch the interactions of our students in buddy classes. I was so proud of them for helping each other, working together and showing SPOT on behavior. Ask your child who his/her buddy class is and what things they do together. I know there are great things planned between the classes!

### Other Important Reminders:

**All absences, late arrivals, and early dismissals need a parent note** or are unexcused. Be sure to include the child's first and last name and the teacher's name. Even if you have called the school to report an absence, we still require a note upon returning to school. For a copy of "A Note to School" please go to <http://ges.sites.fcps.org/attendance>. **Address change:** Please provide a new proof of residency (a copy of a property tax bill, gas bill, electric bill, water/sewer bill or a signed current lease/rental agreement; NO phone/cable bills).

**Custody change:** If there is a change in child custody, please make sure you share that information with your child's teacher and the office. It is extremely important that a copy of the court document be delivered to the school and placed in the child's permanent record folder. Should the school not have this documentation, we have no recourse but to release your child to either parent upon request.

**Wellness-Food Use:** FCPS Wellness Regulation 400-82 states in part:

- For health and safety reasons, parents/visitors are only permitted to bring in food that is intended for consumption by their individual student.
- For health and safety reasons, students are only permitted to bring in food for personal consumption.

**Weapons:** Possession of any firearm or other weapon by a student on school property is strictly forbidden. This also includes look-alike weapons. The penalties for violation are detailed in the Discipline section of the FCPS handbook. Please remember it is a serious offense to possess a weapon of any kind on school property.

### Bus Transportation

**Students may ride only the school bus to which they are assigned.** Inviting friends to ride the bus home is sometimes problematic as some busses are extremely crowded and over capacity. In an emergency situation only, both students are required to have a parent note. This note must be signed by parents. Drivers will not transport any student without a note and/or on their bus roster. Please note that some notes may not be approved due to overcrowding. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

### Outside Activities During Cold Weather – Elementary Guidelines:

It is difficult to set guidelines that fit every circumstance and condition with regards to outside activities during cold weather. Principals use their discretion and good judgment as to whether or not students will go outside, as well as the duration of the outside activity. Sometimes we may opt for a shorter recess period in cold temperatures or specify a temperature above 20 degrees as the cut off point for going out. Elementary students should not go outdoors for recess or physical education whenever the temperature falls below 20 degrees, including the wind chill factor. The temperature cut off at Glade is 22 degrees, so please remember to dress your student in the appropriate clothing (labeled coat, hat and gloves). We will honor parent's reasonable requests that a student be allowed to stay indoors.





**MEDICATIONS IN SCHOOL:** ALL medications to be taken at school, whether prescription or non - prescription (over-the-counter), **must** have a Medication Authorization form completed by the child's health care provider and parent. This form is available from the Health Room Staff and at [www.fcps.org](http://www.fcps.org). This form along with the medication, in a properly labeled prescription bottle or the original unopened over-the-counter bottle or package, must be given directly to the Health Room Staff by the parent/guardian. **FCPS Regulation 400-23 states students are not permitted to carry medications to and from school.**

### **When Should I keep my child home?**

Please keep your child home if these symptoms present and if these symptoms persist for more than 24 hours, contact your child's health care provider. If your child comes to the health room complaining of such you will be called to possibly pick he/she up from school.

#### **Important Signs of Illness:**

- *Temperature greater than or equal to 100 degrees*
- *Nausea or Vomiting*
- *Stomachache*
- *Diarrhea*
- *Pale or flush face*
- *Headache*
- *Persistent cough*
- *Earache*
- *Thick discharge from nose*
- *Sore throat*
- *Rash or skin infection*
- *Red or pink eyes*
- *Loss of appetite*
- *Loss of energy or decrease in activity*

Please keep your child home from school for 24 hours after the last episode of vomiting, fever, and/or diarrhea. If these symptoms persist for more than 24 hours, you should contact your child's health care provider.
