CRITERIA:

- 1. A student majoring in an agricultural and/or trade area of study.
- 2. Demonstrate academic achievement—excellence in effort and performance. A current high school or college transcript must be submitted with the application.
- 3. Demonstrate outstanding service to community and involvement in leadership and extracurricular activities.
- 4. Clear statement of educational goals.
- 5. Financial need will be considered, but it is not the primary factor in selecting winners.
- 6. Provide two letters of reference.
- 7. Complete the application form by the designated time. All applications must be typed.
