To all our sixth grade parents,

A tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis booster (Tdap) and a Meningococcal (MCV) vaccine are required before entry into the seventh grade. If your child has already received these vaccines, please obtain documentation now and send to the health room. If your child has not received these vaccines, please call your physician as soon as possible to schedule a visit. This information is needed in health charts right away! Without documentation of these vaccines, your child/children will be excluded from school starting the very first day of school!!

Other Important Reminders:

All absences, late arrivals, and early dismissals need a parent note or are unexcused. Be sure to include the child's first and last name. Even if you have called the school to report an absence, we still require a note upon returning to school. For a copy of "A Note to School" please go to http://wms.sites.fcps.org/attendance. To review the entire FCPS policy, please visit page 38 of the FCPS Calendar Handbook.

Address change: Please provide a new proof of residency (a copy of a property tax bill, gas bill, electric bill, water/sewer bill or a signed current lease/rental agreement; we are unable to accept phone/cable bills).

Custody: If there is a change in child custody, please share this information with our Counselors and Administration. It is extremely important that a copy of the current court document be delivered to the school and placed in the child's permanent record folder. Should the school not have this documentation, we are required to release your child to either parent upon request.

Wellness-Food Use: FCPS Wellness Regulation 400-82 states in part:

- For health and safety reasons, parents/visitors are only permitted to bring in food that is intended for consumption by their individual student.
- For health and safety reasons, students are only permitted to bring in food for personal consumption.

<u>Weapons:</u> Possession of any firearm or other weapon by a student on school property is strictly forbidden. This also includes look-alike weapons. The penalties for violation are detailed in the Discipline section of the FCPS handbook. Please remember it is a serious offense to possess a weapon of any kind on school property.

Bus Transportation

Students may ride only the school bus to which they are assigned. Inviting friends to ride the bus home is sometimes problematic as some busses are extremely crowded and over capacity.

Both students are required to have a parent note. This note must be signed by parents and turned into the front office to receive a special bus pass signed by Administration.

Drivers will not transport any student without this bus pass and/or any student who is not assigned to their roster. Students may only board and get off at their designated bus stop.

This request should be used for emergency situations only, not for transporting students to parties, work on school projects, etc. WMS administration is unable to approve large groups of students to ride a bus that is not their regular bus.

Please note that some notes may not be approved due to overcrowding. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Math Ms. Owens & Ms. Berrigan: Students are continuing to create and analyze Data Displays. Global Scholar is scheduled for Thursday, May 31st and Friday, June 1st!

Language Arts: Ms. Love & Ms. Moore: Students are continuing to read their novels in order to analyze plot, setting, and theme.

Science:

Donovan/Conrad: Next week we will continue with wave theory for which includes sound and electromagnetic wave. On Monday we will have a Myth busters video and worksheet on sound waves, on Tuesday we will have a lab using slinkys and strings to examine waves, on Wednesday we will have a Max Axiom comic and work sheet on wave theory, on Thursday we will take a benchmark test to ensure students are focused on core principals of waves and then on Friday we will have our field trip to Walkersville High and the escape room WWII theme where the students will solve puzzles and break codes to move onto the next activity.
