<u>Frederick Community College Foundation Scholarships for High School Seniors</u>

- 1. Frederick Singles Scholarship A one year need-based scholarship awarded to one graduating Frederick County High School senior from a single parent household. The scholarship is valued at \$1000 (\$500 each semester). Applicants must have a 2.5 unweighted gpa and be recommended by their high school.
- 2. The Routzahn Family Business Scholarship is a two year scholarship awarded to one graduating senior from each Frederick County Public School High School. The scholarship is valued at \$1000 (\$250 for each semester). Applicants must have a 2.5 gpa and must enroll in 12+ credits and be declared as a Business or Accounting Major. Applicants must be recommended by their high school.
- 3. The FCC Post Dual Enrollment Scholarship is a one year scholarship awarded to one graduating senior from each Frederick County Public Schools High School who participated in the Dual E Enrollment Program (High School Based or Open Campus) through Frederick Community College. The scholarship is valued at \$4400 (\$2200 for fall

and spring semester for one year). Applicants must have a 3.6 unweighted gpa and recommended by their high school.

4. The FCC Merit Scholarship is a two year scholarship awarded to one graduating senior from each of the Frederick County Public Schools High Schools. The scholarship is valued at \$8800 (\$2200 for each fall and spring semester for two years). **Applicants must have 3.6 unweighted gpa and recommended by their high school.**

Summer Programs

**The Johns Hopkins Engineering Innovation Summer (EI) Program will be offered again in 2019, and we hope that you will share information about this exciting course with your students.

El is the summer version of a freshman course offered to engineering students at JHU who have not decided which field of engineering will be their major. We have condensed the semester-long course into four or five weeks. During the course, students complete lab activities in computer, chemical, electrical, computer, civil, mechanical engineering, and materials science. They also prepare a presentation in response to a Request for Proposal, learn about engineering economics, build a spaghetti bridge, and have the opportunity to earn college credit.

This is a great opportunity for students to try college engineering while still in high school. They can decide if they want to pursue an engineering major and which field is of the most interest to them.

Need-based full and partial scholarships are available for commuting students. Students interested in receiving financial aid should apply early.

This course is rigorous, and students must have As and Bs in their high school math and science classes. They also must have taken the following subjects to be eligible to apply:

- q Algebra II
- q Physics or Chemistry
- q Trigonometry, or have learned to use the trig functions up through the application of the laws of sines and cosines to resolve non-right angle triangles in another math course
- q Most students are rising Juniors and Seniors in high school
