Dual Enrollment / High School Based Program at FHS Frederick County Public Schools (FCPS) in partnership with Frederick Community College (FCC) provide students the opportunity to enroll in college courses that are taught at their high school. Students gain exposure to the academic challenges of college while remaining in their supportive high school environment.

Summer Programs

****The Johns Hopkins Engineering Innovation Summer (EI) Program** will be offered again in 2019, and we hope that you will share information about this exciting course with your students.

El is the summer version of a freshman course offered to engineering students at JHU who have not decided which field of engineering will be their major. We have condensed the semester-long course into four or five weeks. During the course, students complete lab activities in computer, chemical, electrical, computer, civil, mechanical engineering, and materials science. They also prepare a presentation in response to a Request for Proposal, learn about engineering economics, build a spaghetti bridge, and have the opportunity to earn college credit.

This is a great opportunity for students to try college engineering while still in high school. They can decide if they want to pursue an engineering major and which field is of the most interest to them.

Need-based full and partial scholarships are available for commuting students. Students interested in receiving financial aid should apply early.
