

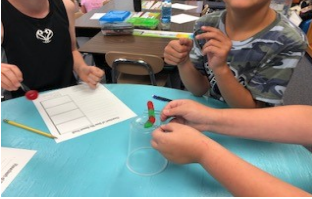

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Language Arts

In September, we have been learning the routines required for a successful reading block. Students have been practicing reading independently and writing in their reading journals.



At home, have your child read for at least 20 minutes each night. Ask them to share what they read. What was exciting, surprising, scary or interesting?

In Writing, we are starting our Unit on Personal Narratives. We will be writing stories about ourselves.

At home, ask your child to share a story about themselves. Talk about experiences they could be writing about in class.

Math

In September, students work with numbers up to 1,000 by rounding, adding, subtracting and completing word problems. Third graders will use place value to round numbers to the nearest ten or hundred, explore strategies for adding and subtracting 3-digit numbers, refine their skills to solve word problems with multiple steps, and identify and analyze patterns within the Addition Table and Hundred Chart.

Practice Rounding to the nearest 10 and 100 at home. Give your child any number and have them round it and explain why it is rounded to that number.
