#### **The OPHELIA Foundation Class of 2019 Scholarships**

The OPHELIA Foundation is pleased to announce its Class of 2019 scholarships.

The OPHELIA Foundation Class of 2019 scholarships support graduating seniors from a high school in the DMV (DC/MD/VA) area. Eligibility requirements and instructions for applying for the 2019 scholarships are outlined below. Only applications received by 11:59 p.m., EST, Friday, April 26, 2019, will be considered.

#### **Eligibility Requirements**

A Class of 2019 applicant must be:

- 1. A graduating senior from a high school in the DMV (DC/MD/VA) area;
- 2. A student with a minimum grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale;
- 3. A U.S. citizen;
- 4. Accepted as a full-time and first-term matriculating freshman at an accredited college or university (excluding the military academies) or an accredited two-year community college at the time the award is presented;
- 5. Planning to pursue a baccalaureatedegree;
- 6. Eligible for the scholarship award as determined by the donor's criteria (refer to the scholarship description for specific criteria).

### **Scholarship Awards**

Eligibility requirements for the OPHELIA Foundation Class of 2019 scholarships are based on criteria set by the donor. Applicants are encouraged to apply for all scholarships for which they are eligible. However, only one scholarship will be awarded to an applicant.



The one-year Class of 2019 scholarship awards will be paid to the recipient's academic institution in one disbursement (contingent on the terms of the Foundation's scholarship memorandum of understanding).

# The Ophelia Scholarship (\$1,000)

The Ophelia Scholarship is named in honor of the Foundation's two namesakes. These amazing women were trailblazers in their own right and excelled on multiple levels. This need-based scholarship will be awarded to a high school senior in the DMV area who is an all-around student. Preference will be given to students who demonstrate financial need.

#### The Gil and Jameece Pinkney Scholarship (\$1,000)

The Gil and Jameece Pinckney Scholarship is named in honor of the Chairman and the Founder of the Foundation in recognition of their visionary leadership. This prestigious scholarship will be awarded to a high school senior in the DMV area who excels academically, exhibits exceptional leadership potential, and is actively involved in band, choir, or sports in addition to their academic and community service activities. Preference will be given to students planning to attend a Historically Black College/University (HBCU).

#### **Application Requirements for the Class of 2019 Scholarships**

Applicants for The Ophelia Scholarship must provide:

1. A typewritten, completed application, with all questions answered, and signed by the parent/guardian and the applicant. The completed application and supporting documentation



(excluding the official high school transcript) must be submitted electronically in one file to <a href="mailto:scholarships@opheliafoundation.org">scholarships@opheliafoundation.org</a>.

- 2. Official high school transcript (with school's seal and in a sealed envelope) mailed to the Foundation.
- 3. Information stating or showing your status as a U.S. citizen (e.g., certified birth certificate, U.S. Passport).
- 4. Two letters of recommendation from:
  - Teacher or Counselor and
  - Community Leader
- 5. Documentation confirming you are a graduating senior from a high school in the DMV (DC/MD/VA) area.
- 6. Evidence that you have a minimum grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale.
- 7. Verification that you meet all scholarship eligibility requirements.
- 8. A copy of your most recent Student Aid Report with your Expected Financial Contribution (EFC) from the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- 9. A typewritten resume listing extracurricular activities (schools, community, church, etc.), jobs, and honors and awards received.
- 10. A typewritten personal statement (not to exceed 650 words) that addresses the applicant's personal, educational, and professional goals, and how an OPHELIA Foundation scholarship will help them achieve their goals.
- 11. A typewritten scholarly essay consisting of a maximum of 650 words that addresses the following essay topic:

### **Essay Topic**

During the past year, the topic of illegal immigration has been in the news almost daily. This issue is fraught with such rancor that it was a major factor in the recent partial government shutdown, as our President sought funds to build a wall on our southern border.

- ✓ Copy of your most recent Student Aid Report with your Expected Financial Contribution (EFC) from the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Report
