MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Oakdale High School Community is to develop thoughtful, lifelong, global citizens through an innovative, rigorous, and supportive learning environment.

ENROLLMENT

Oakdale High School opened in August 2010 as the result of a countywide redistricting process. The attendance area is comprised of residences formerly assigned to Governor Thomas Johnson, Linganore and Urbana high schools. Anticipated enrollment for the 2019-2020 school year is approximately 1,275 students. The school serves an area that is primarily a residential suburb located approximately 6 miles east of Frederick, Maryland.

SCHEDULE

We operate on a two-semester block schedule. Students may complete up to four credits each semester in 80-minute classes. Courses are distinct entities earning full credit in one semester. There are two semesters in each academic school year creating exceptional academic opportunities for students. For example, it is possible for a student to complete both Spanish 1 and Spanish 2 in the same school year or both AP Calculus AB and AP Calculus BC. The schedule also provides additional time for student enrichment. Student Enrichment Time (SET) is a 35-minute interval embedded into the school day to provide students with support to meet the demands of increased academic rigor and to enrich their learning experience.

CURRICULUM

To receive a Maryland High School Diploma, students must earn 25 credits. These include, 4 credits of English, 4 credits of Mathematics (Algebra 1 and Geometry required), 3 credits of Science (Biology required), 3 credits of History, (Government, Modern World History, American Studies required), .5 credit of Health and .5 credit of Fitness, .5 credit of financial literacy, 1 credit of Technology and 1 Fine Art credit. In addition, students must complete a course of study in the area of a world language, advanced technology or a career and technology program. In accordance with Maryland State standards, students must also meet proficiency status on the Maryland assessment exams including HSA and PARRCC and meet the required 75 hours of student service learning or community service.

HONORS and ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

Students are eligible for Honors or AP courses after meeting course and grade pre-requisites, all students who take an AP course are encouraged to take the AP exam. Oakdale High School offers honor level courses in each core academic subject and World Language. Dual Enrollment and On-Line courses are available for students to pursue interests in subject areas not currently offered in the school.

DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM

Our students have the opportunity to access college courses for credit through a partnership with Frederick Community College. The student transcript reflects credits earned through the college dual enrollment program.

DEMOGRAPHICS

Approximate enrollment of 1275 students. Approximately 76% white, 8% Hispanic, 6% Black/African American, 4% Asian and 5% other minority. Approximately 8% qualify for free or reduced lunch.
