RECENT HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2022

- FCC's Hospitality, Culinary, and Tourism Institute (HCTI) was named one of the top culinary schools in the country by KaTom. KaTom, an independent restaurant supply company, ranks schools using data from the U.S. Department of Education's College Scorecard. FCC's HCTI was ranked #9 out of the 700 schools reviewed.
- ➤ FCC's class of 2022 included 927 students, ranging from ages 17 to 73.
- ➤ The first Early College class graduated 15 students. The program begin in fall 2020 where high school students attend FCC full-time during their junior and senior years of high school.
- FCC Baseball made it to the NJCAA DII World Series in Oklahoma. The Cougars ended their season with a 42-7 record.
- FCC launched Navigate, a free moble app designed for college students. Navigate connects students to campus resources, reminds them of deadlines, and allows for easy scheduling of appointments with advisors.



THE MOSAIC CENTER

A new space at FCC! MOSAIC is an acronym for Making Our Spaces An Inclusive Community, and the MOSIAC Center seeks to do just that. We celebrate diversity through cultural, religious, and traditional festivities,

address inequities through courageous conversations, promote inclusion through intentional interaction, and much more. The goals of the MOSAIC Center are: every student will feel included on our campus and understand that their contribution to our community is valued, every student will have the opportunity during their time at FCC to challenge their perceptions of the world and think critically about their beliefs, and



every student will be able to engage in respectful communication with people who differ in both body and mind from themselves. Located in the Student Center, this space will hold different types of programming, events, and celebrations.



NEW FOOD LOCKERS FOR STUDENTS

Frederick Community College has set up a new contactless system to help combat food insecurity. Students in need of food can access it for free through a locker system on campus.

"Students can't sit in a class and do well if they're hungry," said Dr. Benita Rashaw, Associate Vice President of Student Affairs. "As a college, it's imperative that we provide more than academic support. We need to be thoughtful of providing what I call 'when life happens' support. Doing so adds to the overall success of our students, and that's our highest priority."

A study done by the Temple University Hope Center found that 39% of college students enrolled at a two-year institution in fall 2020 indicated they had experienced food insecurity in the previous 30 days.

While FCC has offered a food pantry for years through its Office of Student Leadership and Engagement, that requires a student to come in during office hours to access the food. The pantry also focuses on quick grab-andgo items like granola bars and fruit cups as well as microwavable items.

The new food lockers will differ in that they provide contactless pick-up, are accessible during evening hours, and offer shelf-stable food meant to be prepared at home such as canned meat and vegetables, pancake mix, peanut butter and jelly, and more.

"We know not all students are comfortable talking to someone and saying, 'I need food,'" Dr. Rashaw said. "These lockers make it easier for students to get the food they need at their convenience. We don't want any students to feel embarrassed if they're hungry and need food. There is no shame in that, and FCC is here to help in any way we can."

Each week, FCC will send out a sign-up link for the food lockers through its weekly NewsBlast sent to students. Once signed up, a student will receive their locker number, code, and a deadline for picking up the items. Eighteen students per week will be able to access the lockers.
