Principal's Message

Last week, the FCPS Board of Education determined that students, staff, and visitors will have the option of wearing a facial covering while at school, and then later in the week, the CDC provided new guidance that made wearing masks while traveling on a school bus optional as well. While we recognize the importance of these announcements, we also understand that members of our community share different viewpoints on what has been decided. We will support and honor the decisions our students and families make in whether to wear a mask or not. It is important as we move into the next phase of the pandemic recovery to maintain a school environment where mask choice is respected. To this end, it is important to share that making unwanted comments or gestures to a student based on their personal decision to wear a mask or not is unacceptable and will be grounds for disciplinary action. We have been through a lot together and we will get through this new change together as well. I want to thank our community for following the facial covering mandate this year and want to thank you in advance for respecting those who make a different choice about masking. We will continue to be our best- masked or unmasked!

Spring Testing

As the weather gets warmer, it is important to remember that WKMS is required to complete state testing during the second half of the school year. Please see below for pertinent information and reminders about the testing process for us this spring. It is important to note that these dates for testing includes both students enrolled at WKMS as well as our students who are enrolled in the middle school BVP virtual school program. Maryland State Testing will occur in the morning on the following dates:

- MISA Science Testing (grade 8 students only): March 9th and March 10th
- MCAP ELA Testing (all students): April 11th and April 12th
- MCAP Math Testing (all students): April 26th and April 27th
- SS/Government Testing (grade 8 students only): May 10th and May 11th
- HS Algebra / HS Geometry Testing (select students only): May 16th and May 17th

Additional Testing Information:

- It is important for students to be well rested and get a good night sleep in preparation for testing on each of these dates.
- Please (if at all possible) make every attempt to get students to school on-time and avoid scheduling appointments during testing.
- All students will need to bring corded headphones for use on the assessments.

Arrival and Dismissal

AM Arrival

Buses pull up to the front of the building at the main entrance (by the canopy) for students to enter
the building. For parent drop off, please pull your vehicle to the back of the school building and
remain in line with other parent vehicles. Students will get out of the vehicle at the side walk and
enter the building at the back entrance. As you've probably noticed, the traffic gets fairly busy in and
around WKMS from 7:45-8:00am. The school opens at 7:30am for students if you want to avoid the
traffic.

PM Dismissal

O Buses will again line up at the front of the building at or near the main entrance (by the canopy). For parent pick-up, students will exit the rear of the building and wait on the sidewalk. Parents should pull your vehicle to the back of the school building and remain in line with other parent vehicles; your child will walk up to you directly from the sidewalk. Parents should avoid exiting the line or waiting in a WKMS parking space; this process slows down dismissal and can put students at greater risk with an increase to traffic movement.

Safety Reminders for Students Who Walk to School

When students are traveling to and from school, it is critical to look both ways before crossing the street. While we encourage all motorists to be on the lookout for students in the morning and afternoon, there's always a possibility that a driver could be distracted. It should never be assumed that a driver will stop.

At intersections with crossing guards, it is critical for students and motorists alike to follow their direction. Crossing guards are trained to ensure the safety of students! Students should avoid speaking to strangers and never get in the car of someone they do not know. Students, if a stranger approaches you, immediately get away and tell a trusted adult and school staff. The Frederick County Sheriff's Office has provided the following suggestions for students:

- Students should know a direct route to the school and parents should walk the route with their child(ren) before allowing them to walk the route alone.
- Obey all traffic laws and use crosswalks when available.
- Young children should be accompanied by an adult when walking to school, especially when crossing a roadway.
- Students should refrain from using electronic devices or headphones while walking.
- Be aware of your surroundings and walk with a buddy or group.
- Avoid secluded routes or short cuts.
- Know an alternative route home if the primary route is unavailable (road construction, emergency, etc.).
- Wear bright clothing.
- Do not provide a stranger with any information about yourself or the school you attend.
- If a motorist stops to ask for directions or for help finding a lost pet, never approach the vehicle.
- Never accept rides from strangers, or even people you know, without permission from your parents.
- If someone calls out to you, approaches you, or makes you feel uncomfortable, quickly get to the nearest adult you trust and tell them what happened.
- See something, say something! Report suspicious activity to a trusted adult, parent, police or school official.

TutorMe

All Frederick County Public Schools middle and high school students have 24/7 access to virtual tutoring services for help on any subject. In September, the Board of Education of Frederick County voted unanimously to approve a contract between FCPS and TutorMe for virtual tutoring opportunities, which are now available for students in Grades 6-12. "FCPS teachers remain the absolute best tutors for our students," FCPS Superintendent Dr. Terry Alban said. "We believe this virtual tutoring option will be a valuable additional support when students are working on homework, preparing for exams and needing immediate assistance." TutorMe provides support for hundreds of subjects on demand and has thousands of verified tutors who are experts in their fields and go through background checks. Students can receive assistance through audio and video chats any time of day or night. Students can decide whether to receive support through messaging. Audio and video chats are also available. Assistance is available on virtually any subject matter. For example, students can get an essay edited or a math question answered. Tutoring is also available for students preparing for Advanced Placement exams. Students can access TutorMe using the Clever portal. Details for how to do so are posted online.

Wolverine Time

<u>Wolverine Time</u> is a tutoring program that will be used to support students academically, particularly in ELA and Math. Beginning in October, WKMS staff began offering Wolverine time 4 days per week at a variety of times in the evening in order to create flexibility for our students and families, Wolverine Time will be offered synchronously. Initially, students will have the opportunity to drop-in to the tutoring sessions in order to receive support with homework, feedback on assignments, and help with studying for assessments.


local history during the war. Permission slips will be given in 8th grade social studies classes. Space is limited to 35. There will be a small fee for this trip.
