

SAT Test Day Information*

***This information is for Seniors who have already registered for the School-Based SAT.**

Test Day and Time

The SAT will be administered on **Tuesday, October 27, 2020**. Students will begin testing at 8 am and should be finished testing at approximately 12 noon.

Students must arrive at the building between 7:30-7:45 am.

Arrival

It is important that **students arrive at the school no later than 7:45 am** so that we can begin testing at 8 am. **Students who arrive after testing has started will not be admitted.**

To assist with social distancing guidelines, **students will report to separate entrances of the school, based on their last names (see chart below).** Students will be informed of their testing room upon check-in at their designated entrance. Signs and staff members will be posted outside to assist students in finding their correct entrance, and entrances will be labeled.

Student Last Name	Entrance
A-Fog	A (Main Entrance)
Fol-Kmi	B (200 Hall Exterior Door)
Kni-Sch	C (300 Hall Exterior Door)
She-Z	D (Cafeteria Exterior Door)

What to Bring

Student must bring the following to the test:

- At least 2 No. 2 pencils with erasers
- Approved Calculator

- Photo-ID (government issued or school ID)
- Bottled water and snack (water fountains will be accessible)
- Mask or other type of cloth face covering

Preparation

Breakfast & Lunch

Once students report to their testing locations, they will be offered the opportunity to eat breakfast. Our Food and Nutrition staff will stop by classrooms to serve students at no cost.

Once students are finished with the SAT, they may stop by the cafeteria to pick up a “to go” lunch at no cost. Students will not be permitted to eat lunch in the cafeteria.

Safety Protocols

In order to participate in the SAT, students must wear a mask or face covering over their mouth and nose at all times. Additionally, students must work to maintain proper social distancing (at least 6 feet) from other individuals at all times.
