Message from the Health Room

We are entering into tick season. There are multiple types of diseases that can be spread through tick bites including Lyme disease and Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever (RMSF).

Lyme disease is a bacterial infection that is spread through a deer tick bite. Symptoms appear 7 to 10 days after the bite. Some symptoms of Lyme disease include: fever, headache, fatigue, stiff neck,

muscle and joint pain, swollen lymph nodes, achiness, and often times a red bull's-eye rash at the area of the bite. Early treatment usually results in a full recovery. If not treated, Lyme disease can cause arthritis, heart damage, or nervous system problems.

RMSF is a bacterial infection that is spread through a dog tick bite. Symptoms appear 3 to 14 days after the bite. Some symptoms of RMSF include: flu-like symptoms, high fever (above 101F), headache, nausea or vomiting, tiredness, stiff neck, joint pain, and swollen lymph nodes. After 3 to 5 days of symptoms, a red rash usually appears on the hands and feet and then spreads to the rest of the body. If not treated, RMSF can cause death.

Call your healthcare provider after tick bites and/or if you think your child has either one of these diseases.

We want to stress the importance of tick bite prevention through the following actions:

- Remove leaves and clear brush and all tall grass from around your house and at the edge of gardens.
- Avoid tick-infested areas.
- Wear light-colored clothing so ticks can be spotted more easily.
- Tuck pant legs into socks and shirts into pants.
- Wear a hat and long sleeved shirt for added protection.
- Spray insect repellant containing 20-50% DEET on clothing and exposed skin but not the face.
- Walk in the center of trails to avoid overhanging grass and brush.
- Check for ticks after being outside, especially on children.
- Check your dog for ticks after being outside for any long period of time or if it has been in the woods or tall grass.

Hello Oakdale families and friends – I hope that everyone had a wonderful spring break! So many exciting things have been happening and are still coming up for these last few weeks of school:

- I had the privilege as the OES Safety Patrol Coordinator to attend the Baltimore Orioles' game against the New York Yankees with many of our OES Safety Patrollers on April 8. - Small groups for term 4 are in full swing and we're covering a wide variety of things: school anxiety, friendship skills, being respectful to peers, impulsivity, how to effectively read body language, organizational skills, and many more! Our OES kids are a blast to work with in these small settings, and in addition to first and foremost being helpful to our students, it's also a great way for me to get to know our kids even better.
- Term 4 lessons are beginning this week as I visit Kindergarten classrooms and talk with them about listening skills: listening to others as well as listening to our own inner voice, with an

emphasis on being kind to ourselves! So often the way we talk to ourselves – the negative self-talk – can be worse than bullying from the *outside*.

- Beginning the week of May 15th I will be visiting 4th grade classrooms to discuss citizenship, random acts of kindness, and the possible responsibilities they can take on as 5th grade helpers next year. That same week I will also get to present one of my favorite lessons to 5th graders as we talk about "Movin' On Up" to middle school!
- May 22nd 26th I will be presenting lessons to first and third grade about what possible careers lay ahead for them and, maybe of even more importance, the excitement around how to choose!
- Returning from Memorial Day weekend we will celebrate the uniqueness of each of our 2nd graders as we connect to their science unit and celebrate the idea that in some pretty cool ways we are "Just Like the Butterflies".
